


## ReDOING GENDER 1.5

## STAGING AND PLAYING SPACE


The performance takes place on a 5x5 meters square of white dance floor placed diagonally at the corner of the stage. Black dance floor is placed under the white floor and covers the entire stage.

#### **COMPANY EQUIPMENT**

- 1 Mac book pro for the running of lights
- 4 suspending lamps (x2 green, x2 red hung from ceiling as lighting effect & scenography)
- 2 latex masks (Ape mask, Crying baby mask)
- 1 bottle of Theatre blood
- Costumes: Blazer jacket, white shirt, male underwear, bra, jeans, glasses. 2 wigs (blond and brunette), 2 latex masks (Ape mask and Crying Baby mask), stiletto shoes in shoe box.



# ReDoing GENDER 1.5 is part of: The GENDERhouse 2013-18

ReDoing GENDER is part of a bigger five year research engine titled The GENDERhouse projects. The GENDERhouse is an umbrella name that houses Himherandit Productions ongoing artistic research dedicated to gender related topics. The GENDERhouse as a whole contains six independent performance productions. The first production began in 2013 with more underway and planned to span out towards 2017. The projects between 2013-2018 include: The MANhouse, The WOMANhouse, ReDoing GENDER 1.0 & 1.5, WoMAN & WOMAN, G.A.R.D.E.N, TransGenderHouse, Talking GENDERS Community Projects and The GENDERhouse Retrospective.

Each project that is part of The GENDERhouse is uniquely different from the other as a new focus is put into view every year. From masculinities, femininities to the non heteronormative, the projects take form into: staged productions, Live art installations, Community based research projects and collaborative meeting points for networking and artistic investigation between different international artists who are working with themes of gender.
