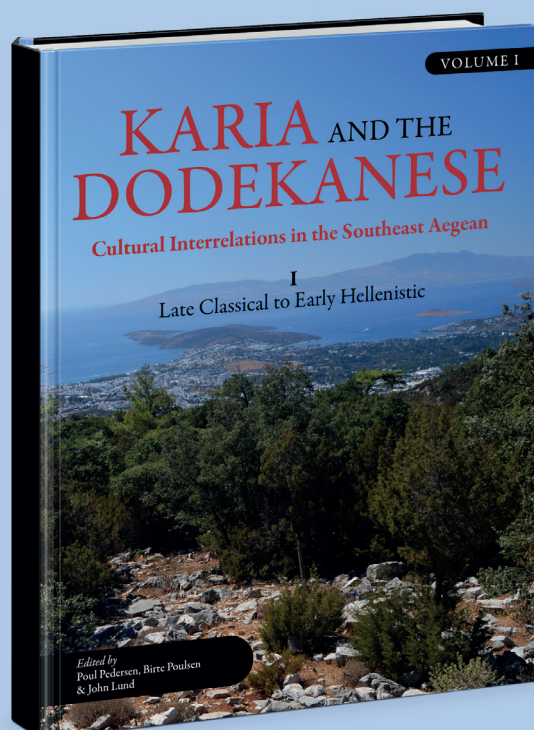


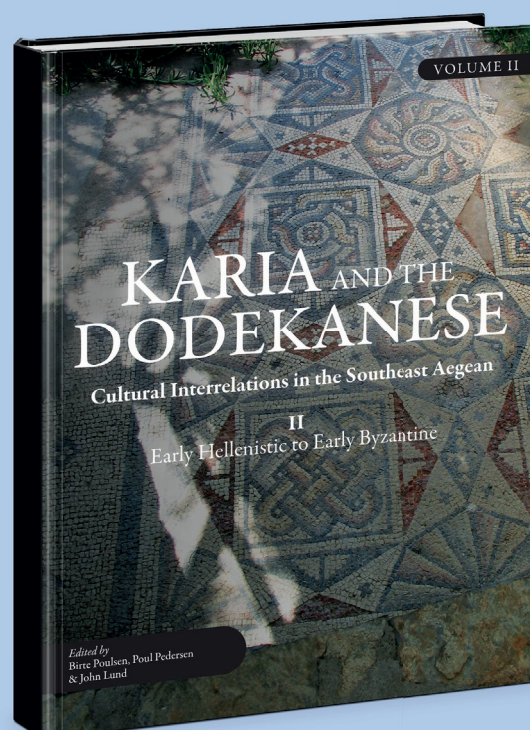

Throughout antiquity, this region was a dynamic meeting place for eastern and western civilizations. Comprehensive and valuable research has been carried out on many individual sites in Karia and the Dodekanese, but the results have rarely been brought together in an attempt to paint a larger picture of the culture of this region. Vol I examines and contrasts developments in literature, philosophy, art, architecture and economy before and after the fourth century 'Ionian Renaissance', and the influences of the Hekatomnid family and Alexander the Great on the dynamics of urbanism and cultural centres. It is clear that close relations existed between the Dodekanese and western Asia Minor during the Classical period (Vol. I), but these relations were evidently further strengthened under the shifting political influences of the Hellenistic kings, the Roman Empire, and the cosmopolitan late antique period. Vol II demonstrates how the sea did not constitute an obstacle to interaction between societies and cultures, but an effective means of communication for the exchange of goods, sculptural styles, architectural techniques, ideas and people among the cities and settlements of the area
