






Ascending and Descending the Acropolis

Sacred Travel in Ancient Attica and its Borders



Saturday 15th Nov 2014 Workshop at the Danish Institute at Athens

Organized under the auspices of the collaborative research project *The Emergence of Sacred Travel: Experience, Economy, and Connectivity in Ancient Mediterranean Pilgrimage (EST),* supported by the Sapere Aude career programme of the Danish Council for Independent Research

Focused on the sacred topography of the Athenian Acropolis, this workshop discusses different aspects of sacred travel or pilgrimage in Ancient Attica. The Acropolis and the nearby Agora were not only the religious and political centres of Athens, but also functioned as a starting and ending point for several regional processions and pilgrimages around Attica, like the *theoria* to Brauron, Eleusis and the panathenian festival. Several sanctuaries on its slopes were the goal of individual piety and pilgrimages, like the Asclepieion at the south slope. Last but not least in roman times the Acropolis itself became a centre of pilgrimage for philhellenic tourism.

The workshop will include discussions of the material footprint of different activities and movements undertaken by pilgrims in ancient Attica and the spatial organization of the sanctuaries of pilgrimage.
